# Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting of Burton and Dalby Parish Council held on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> February 2024 in Great Dalby Village Hall at 7.00 pm

#### 141/23 Apologies for Absence

Apologies were received from Councillors Davies and Blewett and Borough Councillor Bob Child.

# **143/23** Agree and Sign Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on Wednesday **31**<sup>st</sup> January **2024**

It was resolved that the Minutes from the meeting held on Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> Janaury2024 were correct and these were duly signed by the Chairman.

# 144/23 Matters Arising from the Minutes of Parish Council Meeting held on Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> Janaury 2023

Agenda items for the February meeting addressed any action points from the January meeting.

#### 145/23 Opportunity for County/Borough Councillors/members of the public to speak

There were no County/Borough Councillors or members of the public in attendance.

#### 146/23 A606 Burton Road Closure - Update

- (a) Leicestershire County Council, Galiford Try and Severn Trent Water Councillor Ingram advised that some road repairs to those affected during the closure of the A606 would be taking place tomorrow and Friday.
- (b) Lessons Learned Report Councillor Wilkinson had produced a Lessons Learned Report from the closure of the A606 from a range of communications and postings on village Facebook pages. Following discussions, Councillors agreed to make some minor amendments to the document. It was proposed by Councillor Ingram and seconded by Councillor Watson that when the amendments had been made the Report should be sent to representatives from LCC and Galiford Try. Councillor Ingram thanked Councillor Wilkinson for his efforts in preparing a comprehensive document.

#### 147/23 Traffic Monitoring - Update

Prior to the meeting Councillor Wilkinson had forwarded to Councillors maps showing the location of the pneumatic tubes that were laid in 2023 and where he proposed that they were laid this year. It was agreed that Councillors would contact Councillor Wilkinson with their thoughts and comments. The location of the pneumatic tubes will be approved at the March meeting.

#### 148/23 Street-lighting – Update

Councillor Wilkinson advised that he had spoken with a senior engineer at LCC and had been advised as follow:

The Parish Council has a Service Level Agreement with LCC for the street-lighting it is responsible for. The annual SLA charge covers energy costs plus maintenance and costs continue to increase with energy costs.

There are 35 Parish Council owned street-lights in the Parish: 21 in Great Dalby, one in Little Dalby and 13 in Burton Lazars. In addition, there is 25 LCC Street-lights which mainly relate to the small estates at Barnard Close, Child Close, The Close and Church Lea which were constructed by developers and then adopted by LCC for maintenance. LCC plans to dim these lights will not affect the PC owned lights.

LCC recommends converting all the streetlights to LED and can provide an estimate of the cost. This will be about £200 per light- £120 for the lamp and £80 fitting i.e. £7,000. The Parish Council could expect to recover the cost in 2/3 years. Each bulb would be expected to last 10yrs.

The streetlight between Burdetts Close and Main Street will cost a bit more as there is no road access and scaffolding will be required to change the light.

If the bracket needs replacing the cost will be about £500 and a new column £1,000. Heritage style lights are about 5 times the cost.

LCC recommends that a CMS be installed at the same time. This is an intelligent street lighting system, consisting of wireless nodes connecting individual lights. The system pays for itself in reduced energy and maintenance costs, improves quality of maintenance through automatic fault reporting and turns streetlight poles into hubs for smart city sensors. Lights can be adapted to community requests for dark skies, safer streets, energy efficiency. 'presence detection' and 'motion sensing' capabilities use the presence of cars, pedestrians and cyclists to control the ambient light level known as traffic adaptive lighting.

Councillors discussed the erecting of a second street-light on Church Lane in Little Dalby (a 100% increase) and Councillor Wilkinson has taken the task on board to discuss with the Senior Engineer at LCC.

It was proposed by Councillor Wilkinson and seconded by Councillor Johnson that the Parish Council requests an estimate for this work from LCC and that the proposal be brought back to a future meeting.

#### 149/23 Parish Councillors' Village Walkabout – Update

Councillor Ingram advised that the Parish Council Assets Team had viewed the Parish Council's assets and reported that they were mostly in good condition. Attention needs to be given to the Great Dalby Wash-dyke, the erection of a litter bin at Nether End, Great Dalby, a general maintenance check on the village notice-boards and the replica pump and railings on Great Dalby Green.

The bench outside the church in Burton Lazars requires attention. The Clerk advised that this was not a Parish Council asset but was donated by the WI. The Clerk will approach the WI and suggest that they apply to the Community Fund for the materials required.
